Legacy Gala Honors Seabees

he Ronald Reagan Presidential Library in Simi Valley,
Calif., was the location for the first annual Seabee
Legacy Gala by the CEC/Scabee Historical Foundation.
Some 200 guests, including sponsors of the event,
active-duty Seabees and CEC officers, supporters of the new
Scabee Museum project at the Port Hueneme, Calif., Seabee
base, and Foundation Trustees gathered for the gala event.

After a reception, which enabled all the guests to mix and mingle, the evening began with a video clip by Michael Reagan, son of the namesake of the library. Reagan provided the clip when he unexpectedly had to cancel his plans to join the group for the evening. In his talk, Reagan welcomed all the attendees and spoke warmly of his father's deep admiration and respect for the Seabees, relating several anecdotes about the President's interactions with the Seabees at Camp David.

Rear Adm. Benjamin F. Montoya CEC, USN (Ret.), Chairman, CEC/Seabee Historical Foundation, introduced Dick Butkus, Honorary Campaign Chairman. Butkus spoke to the guests relating how he became involved in the campaign and of the great admiration he has for the Seabees.

"People think guys in the NFL take some licks, but they are nothing compared to what the Scabees go through," Butkus said.

The generous sponsors who made the evening possible were recognized for their support (see the back page for a complete list), and several key attendees were recognized. Mr. Jerry Halpin was asked to come forward for presentation of the first Fighting Seabee award. Mr. Halpin served during World War II with the 109th Naval Construction Battalion (NCB) on Hawaii, Kwajalein and Guarn. He is the lead donor to the new Seabee Museum campaign with contributions totaling \$1.5 million. After the war, Mr. Halpin obtained a degree from Syracuse University and settled in northern Virginia. He co-founded West Group Management Company, which created the office and retail complex at Tyson's Corner, Va., among other major developments in the area.

The Fighting Seabee sculpture presented to Mr. Halpin was created by the world-renowned sculptor A.J. Obara, son of World War II Scabee Anthony Obara, who served with CBDs 1011 and 1022 and the 30th NCB. Obara also donated two other sculptures, which were sold at the live auction. One was a reproduction of the head of the bald eagle sculpture presented to President Reagan, which currently is on display at the library. Obara has taken an intense interest in the new Seabee Museum project.
